 this my Last Will & Testament as follows
 first I Recommend my Soul to God & my body to the dust
 to be Interred by my Executor & as to worldly goods
 Wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with I leave
 it in the following manner I give & bequeath to my
 further Alexander Pitt my Executor in the Land he
 Live on during Life & after his Death to Celine Dixon &
 Lillian Dixon & the Part of William Dixon's Children &
 Burialaby M. Seales if she ever has any Children they
 have to Bear an Equal Part with William Dixon's Chil-
 dren it is my Will that Celine Dixon shall have my
 bed & furniture I want it to be left with my further
 Alexander Pitt till the above named party's Marry or
 is of sufficient age to Receive it & I appoint my further
 Alexander Pitt my Executor to see the whole Executed in
 Testimony of Which I have this Day Set my hand &
 Seal this the 2 Day of July 1839
