George A. Atley Robinson of said  
Jackson County County being of sound  
Mind and disposing memory and considering  
the uncertainty of life do make Constitution and  
ordain this my last will and Testament in the  
following manner to wit;

Item 1<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath unto my nephew  
Frederick A. Lowry my negro man Harry or  
eight hundred Dollars in Money as a specific  
Legacy independent of his equal share of my estate  
after my death.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> It is my wish and desire that my entire  
estate, after all my just debts are paid off including  
the specific Legacies to be equally divided  
between my brothers John & James Lowry and my  
sister Sarah Minberly that part which may fall  
to James Lowry I wish to go exclusively to his five  
children who now lives with my brother James  
as a that part which may fall to my sister Sarah  
Minberly it being her third of the general entire  
estate I wish to be divided into four parts and the  
one fourth of which I give & bequeast unto Charles  
Matham for his proper use and benefit and the  
~~remaining~~ three fourths I give and bequeast to my  
brother John Lowry for the use and benefit of my  
sister Sarah Minberly Jr and during her natural  
life after which it is my wish that her daughter  
Charity Miller should have the same entire with  
a view of enabling her to support her infirmities  
Brother James Minberly now much afflicted

Item 3<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to the Methodist Church  
Constitution of this district five hundred dollars  
to be managed in any way a manner that the Judges  
of the same may think proper

Item 4<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to Francis Wood  
who now lives with me one hundred good Pds and  
francium and it is my desire that the same

lives with my brother John Slavery during which time it is my wish for her to have my negro girl Dolly and should she leave my side my brother John's girl Dolly is to revert and become a part of my estate subject to a disposition as the rest of my Estate Item 5 I Give and bequeath unto John Morris who now lives with me own good bed bedstead furniture and also one good horse Saddle and Bridle It is my wish and desire for my brother John Morris to be very executors for the purpose of carrying the foregoing into Execution

Item 6 I Give and bequeath the following sum Money to the following of my negroes to wit Henry Mary Harry Young Carter Tim Albert Maria Anna Augusta each Fifteen Dollars Anna Lundy Linda each Thirty dollars and Dolly ten Dollars

Item 7 I Give and bequeath unto my nephew John Wimberley One Dollar and no more

It is also my wish and desire that my brother John Slavery see this letter first as well as does not will carried into Execution
