Georgia. I Alex Roberson of said
Jackson County Georgia being of sound
Mind and disposing Memory and Considering
the uncertainty of life do make Constitution and
ordain this my last will and Testament in the
following Manner (To wit);

Item 1st I Give and bequeath unto my nephew
Frederick M Lowry my negro man Harry or
eight hundred Dollars in Money as a specific
Legacy independent of his equal share of my estate
after my death

Item 2^d It is my wish and desire that my entire
estate after all my Just debts are paid off including
the specific Legacies to be divided equally between
between my Brothers John & James Lowry and my
Sister Sarah Wimberly that part which may fall
to James Lowry I wish to go exclusively to the five
Children which now lives with my brother James
as a that part which may fall to my Sister Sarah
Wimberly it being one third of the aforesaid entire
estate I wish to be divided into four parts and two
one fourth of which I Give & bequeath unto Charles
Cuthbert for his proper use and benefit and the
remaining three fourths I Give and bequeath to my
brother John Lowry for the use and benefit of my
Sister Sarah Wimberly for and during her natural
life after which it is my wish that the said Charles
Cuthbert should have the same entire with
a view of enabling him to support her unfortunate
Brother James Wimberly now much afflicted.

Item 3^d I Give and bequeath to the Methodist Church
connection of this district five hundred dollars
to be managed in any way or manner that the Judges
of the same may think proper

Item 4th I Give and bequeath to Francis Wood
who now lives with me on his head and good Bed and
furniture and it is my desire that she should

live with my brother John Lowry during which
 time it is my wish for her to have my negro Girl
 Dolly and should she leave my 1st Brother John
 Girl Dolly is to revert and become a part of my
 estate subject to a disposal as the rest of 1st Estate
 Item 5th I Give and bequeath unto John W.
 who now lives with me on good bed and stand
 for winter and also one good horse saddle and
 It is my wish and desire for my brother John
 to be my Executor for the purpose of carrying the
 -going into Execution

Item 6 I Give and bequeath the following sum
 Mary to the following of my negroes Courtney
 Mary Mary Emily Carter Jim Albert Maria a
 Marga each twenty dollars Anna Lundy 2
 -do each thirty dollars and Dolly ten dollars

Item 7th I Give and bequeath unto my nephew
 John Wimberly One dollar and no more
 It is also my wish and desire that my brother
 John Lowry be the latter part as well as the rest
 with Carol into Execution
