make & declare my last will & testament in manner & form following
to wit, I give & bequeath to my five or and daughters namely
Lee Johns, Malitta Pierce Johns, Elizabeth Christian Johns,
Louisa Johns, & Martha Gelsom Johns, daughters of Jonathan
Johns, all my estate both real & personal which I now poss-
ess of & have, one tract of land of one hundred thirty two
acres which I am charged of Sarah Corcoran in said County of
Jackson, also all my stock of horses, cattle, sheep, hogs & sheep &
all my beds & furniture household & kitchen furniture of
every kind or description whatever unto my aforesaid five
grand daughters their heirs & assigns forever each to have
her proportion of said estate, when the youngest of them
shall become of age, to be equally divided among them
I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint my son in law
Bartholomew Johns my executor of this my last will and
testament, the witnesses whom I then unto sit my
hand & seal this 18th day of March 1812

I give & bequeath to my beloved sons William, David
George & James Bradford the tract of land wherein
I now live containing two hundred & twenty five acres
to be equally divided among them

have her maintenance out of my ~~estate~~
