third I give to Middleton Cap my grand son five hundred Dollars

fourth I give to James Montgomery five hundred Dollars
fifth the Balance of my Property My Including my
lands & the following negroes by a man named
a man Ned a man Jon a man Harry a woman
Suey a woman Jerry a woman Willan a girl
Frances a girl Rody a girl Margaret a boy
and a boy Nathan are to be Equally Divided
Thomas Barrow Drury Currow have James Montgomery
Angel by Currow have John H Currow have William
I leave of my & James Cunningshams real estate
to them their Part being Proportionally Part of the
fifth article of my will It is further my will
that my wife Mary live on the land & it remain
unsold until her Death Provided she may wish
to live on it but when ever it is sold it is to be
Divided as above named in the fifth article of my
will

I Do hereby appoint Thomas Barrow James Montgomery
John H Currow have & William I Cunningsham the Executors
of this my last will & Testament In Testimony
Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 10th
day of June 1811
