I further give & bequeath to my wife Polly a note which I hold on Asa Varnum.

1st I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Polly Dammou all my personal all, property, present and hereafter to be disposed of during her natural life & after her decease to be equally divided between my son Uriah Dammou & my daughter Peggy & Nancy and the children of my daughter Polly Angell & also my plantation Whence I now live during her life together with its appurtenances. I further give & bequeath to my wife Polly a note which I hold on Asa Varmann.

2nd I give the speech to my son Ulrich the plantation that

men once to die — I have thought proper to make this my
last will & testament And first of all I commit my soul into
the hands of the living God who gave it to me, & my body to the
earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner, And as to
the worldly effects which it has pleased God to bless
me with, it is my desire & will that it should be divided
& distributed in the following manner, to wit,
I give the penance unto my beloved daughter Ellice & Eliza each
of them a feather bed & furniture which they have had for
years as their, And secondly I give the penance unto my
beloved son Seymour, Henry, a feather bed & furniture which
shall be raised by executors hereafter named out of my ^{property} estate
to be applied by my executors in schooling the De Seymour
It is my desire that my executors hereafter named & appointed
shall dispose of all the remainder of my worldly effects to the
best advantage & with the least expense to my estate; viz, my
household furniture, tools & crop & stock of all kinds the three
tracts of land which I own viz, the one I now reside on in this
County, one in the County of Early, & one in the County of Lee
all of this State — And that he should out of the proceeds thereof
as soon as possible discharge all my Just debts & funeral expenses
he remunerate himself for the expenses of granting the lots of
land in the County of Early & Lee for his trouble & expenses for
arranging this my will into execution, Fourthly It is my will that
