 Item 1st It is my will that my body be buried in a decent Christian Burial
 Item 2^d after Paying my just Debts it is my will that my Property be Divided as follows (to wit)

Item 3^d to William R. Mann the orphan Boy that I have Reared I give my Negro Boy Wally about nine years of age & one bid V. Bunting if William R. Mann should die before he arrives at at twenty one years of age & without him it is my will that said Boy Wally shall Devise to my Estate

Item 4th the Remainder of my Property of whatever Character it is my Desire shall be Equally Divided between my Son Charles Daugherty Jr. & my Son in Law Andrew Oliver including Wally if he should Devise

Item 5th and Lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint my Friend Med. Sutton Witty Executor of this my last will & Testament
