

Georgia: I Charles McKinney Shun make this my last will
Jackson County } and Testament.

First It is my wish and desire that all my property both real and
personal should be sold to the best advantage so soon as it
can be done after the present crop is gathered (except such arti-
cles as may not be necessary to complete the crop which may be sold
as soon as convenient.)

Second. I give and bequeath to my Sister, Rachel Webb, one hundred
dollars for her attention to me, and taking care of my eldest
daughter, since the death of its Mother.

Third. I give to Miss Frances Hogan one hundred dollars for the
raising my youngest daughter from the death of its Mother
until now. Which shall be full compensation to the family.

The balance of my estate I wish to be equally divided
between my two daughters Polly Ann & Mildred Ann McKinney
when they become of lawful age, or marries to the satisfaction
of my Executors. I wish them (my Daughters) to be under the
Control of my Executors and to be decently educated and
provided for during their minority.

and lastly, I do hereby appoint James Hampton and James
Montgomery the Executors of this my last will and testament
this 31st day of May 1832. Charles McKinney.

hereby make and publish this my last will and Testament.
first - I do hereby give and devise the land whereon I now live in the
following manner that is to say that portion lying on the west side
of Applings Creek is intended for the sole use & benefit of my son
James and daughter Polly, subject to the limitations, changes and
conditions hereinafter mentioned, first that said portion of land
west of said Creek be divided in two equal parts, having due re-
gard to quantity & quality, such division to be made by three dis-
interested persons to be appointed and sworn by the Court of Ordinary, who
shall assign one half to my said son James to be his absolute
property, not subject to the charge which will be hereinafter named,
the other half is given to my executors in trust for the sole use
& benefit of my daughter Polly and her children, if she shall have
