Second. I give to R. J. Johnson five dollars, and to each of his children by my daughter, Milda, fifty dollars -

Third. I give to my daughter, Betsey McLean five hundred dollars -
Fourth. The balance of my estate to be equally divided between my son Wilson McKinney, Samuel McKinney, Sarah Hampton, and Peter McLean - provided nevertheless, that if my wife Elizabeth should live longer than me - I give her for her use, during her lifetime, a negro man, Henry, and a negro woman Peggy, together with the house and a sufficiency of land around it, to support her, her lifetime with other necessaries as she may need. and after her death to be divided agreeable to the fourth division of this will - In testimony thereof I have set my hand and seal -

Codicil - I do hereby appoint James Hamilton and James Bargrove my executors of this my last will and Testament -
