Mother her life time & the whole & Entire Claim & Interest
which I hold, Power of Land Wharion my Mother now
living do to my beloved Sister Eliza Willingham to her &
the heirs of her body in full & complete forever Now should my
beloved Sister Eliza Willingham die without having a child
or children then & in that case I will that the whole of my
Estate above named be Equally divided among my surviving
brothers or their children should they leave any
I nominate constitute & appoint My beloved Sister Eliza Will-
ingham Executor of this my last will & Testament In
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
