And as touching such worldly estate where with it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

1st It is my will and ~~desire~~ that all my just debts and Funeral Charges be paid -

2^d It is my will also, that after my just debts and funeral Charges are paid; that the remainder of my estate be possessed by my beloved wife Sarah Suttus; and to be disposed of by her and my son William Suttus for the support and Education of my little Children.

And I do hereby Constitute, make, and ordain my wife Sarah Executrix and my son William Suttus Executor of this my last will and Testament.
