- 1st It is my will that all my just debts be punctually paid
- 2nd I will to my beloved wife Elizabeth Brazeal all my estate both real & personal during her natural life with following exceptions viz; that at my decease there shall be paid out of my estate to John R. Robertson my grand-son the sum of eighty dollars & at the death of my said wife all the property that may be left or remain of my said estate I will to my grand-son James Smith Alexander Williamson & his heirs forever
- 3rd I hereby nominate & appoint my wife Elizabeth & my son in law John Williamson executors & executor to this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have unto set my hand & seal this sixth day of October 1821
