George Bagby of the State & County aforesaid
Jackson County being in per sound mind & memory & recollection
& calling to mind the uncertainty of life do make this my last
will & testament & looking all others do confirm & ratify this as
my last will & testament to wit, First I resign my soul into
the hands of my gracious & wise creator trusting he will
dispose of the same in mercy & accordingly I submit my body to the
dust to be buried in a plain & decent manner there to rest till
the morning of the resurrection Thirdly I dispose of my worldly
goods in the following manner — I give & bequeath
to my beloved wife Meriam Bagby the land & plantation
whom I now live with all the negroes that is not already
given to Wm. Tom. Charlotte, Frank, Eave, Delphia, Gustus
Rudly, Lucy, & Isaac, also all my stock of horses cattle hogs and
goats & sheep also all my household furniture & working tools
Also all bonds & notes out of which she is to pay all my debts
which I leave to her until my youngest child
comes of age at which time I wish an equal division to be
made of all my property among my sons only except such
as I shall will to my wife & Daughters to wit, I give and
bequeath to my loving wife during natural life the land
& plantation whom I now live with the household furniture
Also four cows & calves two horses half the hogs sheep & goats
I half the working tools also the negroes I have bought

I have & Delphia also two thirds all of which at her decease
 I will to be equally divided among my sons only, to wit,
 John, Joseph, Thomas, Abner, Henry, William & George
 Washington Bagby with the following exceptions to wit that
 a negro boy named Jeroniah which I formerly gave to my
 son John Bagby be valued at the time of such divi-
 sion, & the valuation to be deducted out of his legacy.
 I also desire that my three youngest sons Henry, William
 & Washington be furnished by my executors with a horse
 & saddle apiece of a reasonable value one after another
 as they come of age extra of an equal division in the rest
 of my estate before mentioned. I then to my loving & true be-
 gotten daughter Decry Wood I give & bequeath one negro
 girl named Sylvia & also the stock & other property alrea-
 dy furnished her with

Item I send unto my loving daughter Sally Wood one
 negro girl Radney - mitto & also the stock & other property
 that she has in possession during her natural & at her
 death to her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Rachael Spear,
 one negro girl named Bett together with all the stock
 & property already delivered to her

Item I give & bequeath to my youngest daughter Betsy
 Jeffries Bagby one negro ^{girl} named Seimiah one feather
 & furniture also one cow & calf & one hunting saddle
 & sponce the said negro girl die before her marriage
 or coming of age I will that she be paid three hundred
 dollars out of my other estate in lieu thereof

And I do hereby constitute & appoint my wife Merriam
 Bagby & John Bagby my son & also Joseph Bagby
 another of my sons my legal executors of this my last
 will & testament who may if they should deem it
 expedient sell the land & plantation at any time
 before the decease of my wife Merriam Bagby
 & by her consent to as it she does for the mutual
 interest of the whole of my children concerned
 there in which I have signed & sealed

Jackson County State of Georgia being sick in body but of perfect
mind & memory & calling to mind the mortality of my body do make
to ordain this & no other to be my last will & testament in manner &
form following (N.B.) 1st I recommend my soul into the hands of
almighty God that gave it me & my body I recommend to the
earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discre-
tion of my executors & and as touching such worldly estate
wherein with it has pleased God to bless me with in this life
I give dispose & bequeath the same as follows (N.B.)
1st It is my desire that my lawful debts be paid
2nd I will to my dearly beloved wife Jane Green the place where
she is going to live with a negro girl named Lucy & one
feather bed & furniture during her life or widowhood & also one
bay horse a cow & calf together with such plantation tools
as may be necessary to carry on a farm
