In the name of God Amen this twentieth day of
May in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred
& ~~thirteen~~ I George Bradford of the State of Georgia County
of Jackson Yeoman being very sick & weak in body but
of perfect mind & memory calling unto mind the mortality
of my body & that it is appointed for all men to die do
make & ordain this my last will & testament that is to say
principally first of all I give & recommend my soul
into the hands of God, that gave it & for my body I
recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian
like manner at the discretion of my executor And
as touching my worldly estate I give devise and
dispose in the following manner & form
It is my will & I do order that in the first place all
my just debts & funeral charges be paid & satisfied
And I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint
William Bradford & David Bradford my sons of this
my last will & testament to dispose of and apply all my
estate in the following manner, that is to say
I give & bequeath to my beloved sons William & David
George & James Bradford the tract of land known
as now lie containing two hundred & twenty five acres
to be equally divided among them
It is also my request that my ^{dearly} beloved wife Mary
have her maintenance out of ~~my~~ ^{my} estate

The living
 the said wife, to have all the household & kitchen furniture to
 dispose as she thinks proper, one bed & furniture excepted which
 I do give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary Bradford it
 is also my request that she be furnished with a good horse when
 she marries. I give & bequeath to my son George Bradford my
 young bay mare saddle, It is my request that after the exe-
 cutors sell out as much of the stock of cattle & sheep as
 will discharge the debts that balance, twelve months after
 the publication of this my last will be equally divided among
 all my children that then may be living. It is also my request
 that my beloved wife Mary Bradford have two first shares
 out of the cattle & sheep an equal share with the rest
 And I the said George Bradford do hereby establish and
 confirm this & no others to be my last will & testament & acknowledge
