 the county of Jackson & State of Georgia being of sound mind
 & memory blessed be God, for the same do this 10th day of April
 eighteenth hundred & twenty make & publish this my last will and
 testament in manner & form following first of all I give my soul
 into the hands of almighty God, & I gave it in hope of a joyful
 resurrection at the last when the soul & body shall meet my body
 after my decease I order to be buried in Christian & decent manner
 at the discretion of my executor beside my wife grave
 And after all my just debts are paid & discharged I give off my will &
 pleasure in manner & form as following viz:

- 1st I give & bequeath to my son Benjamin Wilson one quarter of a dollar
- 2nd I give & bequeath to son in law James Hag, and wife one quarter of a dollar
- 3rd I give & bequeath to my son Robert Wilson one quarter of a dollar
- 4th I give & bequeath to my George W Wilson one quarter of a dollar
- 5th I give & bequeath to my son in law John Casey one quarter of a dollar

- 6th I give to my son John Wilson one quarter of a dollar
 7th I give them as Wilson one quarter of a dollar—
 8th I give the right to son in law Moses Wilson wife one quarter of a dollar
 9th I give the right to son James Wilson one quarter of a dollar—
 10th I give the right to my grandson George Wilson my debt to him
 this right forever
 I give the right to my son William Wilson the balance of my
 land plantation whatever it may be 70 or 80 Acres after
 James gets his 90 Acres station off. the old plantation to him
 his heirs & assigns forever also all my dwelling houses and
 farming utensils household furniture one bed of feathers
 that he has now as mine he is to keep stable & chest and
 kitchen furniture pots & chairs, with every movable article
 on my plantation or in my houses or else where belong to me
 the following is a receipt to the above with all my body
 clothes of every kind & all my books I give the right to William
 Wilson, I give the bed & the furniture to Martha Wilson
 all my small things in my desk every kind. My will and
 pleasure is that George Wilson pay twelve dollars to William
 Wilson I do declare & pronounce this to be my last will
 & testament in presence of us given under my hand & seal
 this the first day of May 1843 George Wilson & Co
