I mean the twelve month day of April in the year of our Lord 1810, I the said Samuel Haggard of the County of Jackson Georgia formerly being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory that I let give to God for the same & calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will & testament that is to say principally first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of God who gave it & for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God, I trusting such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in manner and form following, Viz. In the first place I give & bequeath to Sarah Snow our negro woman Jackson County Mills 1803-1860
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I shewings, likewise one negro woman named Susor & all her offsprings
 and one negro woman named Tabby & all her increase together with all my
 household goods & moveables I likewise make & ordain Mark Snow
 my only sole executor & Elizabeth his wife, of this my last will & testament
 and heretofore mentioned by him freely to be by the foregoing; all
 the rest of my heirs & Legates I cut off as the law of the State directs
 And I do hereby disallow & revoke & disannul all & other former
 testament, Wills & Legacies bequeaths & Executor by me in any
 Ways. before this time named Wills & bequeaths, Ratifying and
 confirming this & no other to be my last will & testament, As
 witness whereof I have set my hand & seal the day & year
 above written
