 disposing memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life,
 do hereby make my last will and Testament, revoking all
 Wills heretofore made by me;

Item 1st I resign my Body to the Grave, and my soul into the hands
 a gracious God, in hope of a glorious resurrection and
 everlasting life.

Item 2nd I desire that all my Just debts be discharged.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Phebe
 Boring, all the land pertaining to the Tract whereon I
 now reside, including the plantations and appurtenances,
 together with all my stock of Horses, Hogs, Cattle &c. and
 also the following Negroes. To wit. Mrs. Sam, Esther,
 Lewis, Moriah, Reuben, Willis, Caroline, Clary, Mary,
 and Polly, during the term of her natural life, with a dis-
 cretion in her my said wife Phebe, and my Executors here-
 after named, to sell any of the personal, or real property above
 specified, or implied, at any time they may think proper, & best
 adapted to the interest of the Legatee.

Item 4th At the decease of my wife, Phebe Boring, I give and bequeath
 to my children hereafter named, an equal dividend of all the
 property specified in the above and third item, or the proceeds
 thereof, to wit, John Boring, Elizabeth Lyle, Robert Boring, &c.
 Isaac Boring, Phebe Johnson having regard to the property
 already given, and for which receipts are taken.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Susannah Vais five
 dollars, to be paid to her by my Executors out of my money
 arising from the sale of any of my property.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my Grand Children, Adenath Adams,
 Sarah Adams, Elizabeth Adams, Joseph Adams, Phoebe
 Adams, Delilah Vais, and Mary Vais, one seventh part of
 my Estate, placing them in the same situation, and allowing
 them collectively the same share allowed to the rest of my
 children.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my Grand Children, by my daughter
 Adenath Waper deceased, to wit, Thomas Jackson, &c.
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Waper, one seventh part of my Estate, for one seventh to be equal
divided between the two.

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter, Sarah Adams
named in the Sixth Item, in addition to that Legacy, one
Bed and furniture, one bow and calf -

Item 9th I give and bequeath to my Grandson, Samuel Jackson Waper
one feather Bed and furniture, and one Horse Coll. in
addition to his Legacy aforesaid.

Item 10th All the residue of my Estate, real or personal, to wit:
Tract Land in the County of La, two Tracts in the County of
mett, One in Jackson Wheron David Thomas formerly and
joining Waid Station, I give and bequeath to my Children
Grand Children under the same rule and proportion by which
their several Legacies are herein before regulated. And that
Executors do proceed to sell and dispose of the said Land
as soon as it may be thought by them to be most expedient
and conducive to the interest of the respective Legates, so
that distribution of the proceeds thereof may be made.

Item 11th It is to be understood as the true intent and meaning of
forgoing Items making distribution of my property between my
Children and Grand Children, that each respective Family of
Children, are to be entitled to no more than an Individual
from whom they descended would be entitled, upon an equal
division of the whole property. It is also to be understood, that
the word appurtenances, in the third Item, is intended to mean
Household and Kitchen furniture, working tools, or whatever
be found upon the premises belonging to me.

Item 12th It is my Will and desire that should both of my Grand Children
Thomas Waper, and Samuel Jackson Waper, die while in an Age
Minority, and heireless, that all the property bequeathed to them
revert to my other Children, and in the same proportion of their
other Legacies.

I do hereby appoint Thos Boring, John Boring, and Isaac Boring
my lawful Executors of this my last Will & Testament. In Wit-
ness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of October

I Rufel Sons of Franklin County, & State of Georgia
 do make & declare this to be my last will and Testament
 hereby revoking all others. First my will is that my Just
 debts be paid. Secondly, I give unto my dear wife Sarah
 Sons during her natural life or widowhood, all that part
 of the tract of land wherein I now live, and which I pur-
 chased of Thomas Miniwether, that lies on the North side of
 Naked Creek including my Mill thereon, provided she
 shall not be permitted to lease, rent or otherwise permit
 any one to, cultivate, or otherwise occupy any part thereof.
 I further give to my said wife Sarah, during her natural
 life or widowhood, one Negro Girl Anich. I further give
 unto my said wife during her natural life, the Negro wo-
 man named Oaty and one negro man named Friday
 in terms of a Marriage Contract entered into between
 my said wife and myself prior to our intermarriage, the
 named Negro Oaty is, in lieu of Oier, named in said Marri-
 age Contract. I further give unto my said wife, during her
 natural life, Two Horses worth sixty dollars each, two feather
 Beds, Bedsteads, & furniture, Two Cows & Calves, one Bureau, my
 sideboard & Clock, my Cupboard, one Carding Machine one
 third of my sideboard & Cupboard furniture, one sitting Chair,
 six silver teaspoons, one common Table Two spinning wheels,
 and two small trunks. Also, one third of my Stock of
 Hogs, together with a sufficient quantity of Corn & fodder
 for her support until she can raise a
