control & use of all the household furniture & stock & cattle & sheep
she is in possession of during her life & then to be disposed of as herein
after mentioned

It is my wish for all my Just debts to be punctually paid

It is also my will & wish for all the residue of my estate
which consist in money notes & others &c. & some personal prop-
erty designated in the Lth Item, to wit: Cattle, sheep & household
furniture to be divided among the following names of my
Children Share & Share alike to wit: Joseph Burson, Hannah
Thomas, Isaac Burson, Sally Newton, Delila Shaw, Elisha Burson
& Brookfield Burson

I Appoint my two sons Joseph Burson & Elisha Burson
my exors to this my last will & Testament & working all
other wills or Testaments heretofore by me made & declaring
them by these presents to be null & void. In witness
