 Mind & Disposing Memory thanks be given to God almighty to mind the Mortality  
 of my body & knowing that it is appointed unto man to die do make this my last  
 Will & Testament that first & Chiefly I give & Command my soul to God who  
 gave it & my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken to decent Burial there  
 buried nothing doubting but that I shall receive it again at the general  
 Resurrection by the Mighty Power of God as touching what worldly substance  
 it has pleased God to bless me with I give & dispose of in the following manner  
 first I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Agnes Mough during her natural life  
 all the rest of land wherowever I now live with all the appurtenances thereto  
 belonging with all the Stock of every Kind & also all my horse hool & Hethen  
 Furniture with all & every other Species of Property of every Kind whatsoever and at  
 her Death I give & bequeath the whole of the above named Property of every Kind  
 unto my Daughter Elizabeth Minigh poor but Boreid my life except Minigh  
 Should be the longest Lire then she is to have the Right to Disposse of the whole  
 as she may see fit & Proper but Provided my Daughter Elizabeth Mough Should  
 be the longest Lire then she is to have the full Disposition of the whole  
 Lastly I appoint James Hargrave my sole & Lawfull Executor of this my last Will  
 & Testament In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affix  
 my Seal 28<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1843
