In the name of God, amen, I Jacob Pettigrew of the State
 of Georgia County of Jackson being rasy sick & weak but of perfect
 mind & memory should be given unto God calling into mind the
 mortality of my body & knowing that I am appointed for all men
 once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & testament: Viz,
 principally, first I give & recommend my soul into the hands
 of almighty God, that give it & my body I recommend to the earth to
 be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my
 executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall
 receive the same again by the ^{grace} of God & as touching such
 worldly estate where with it has pleased God to bless me in
 this life, I give devise & dispose of the same in the following
 manner to wit

First I give & bequeath to Betsey my dear & the loved wife the sum
 of five dollars to be paid out of my estate when she shall
 call on my executors, & to James my son I give the bequeath
 the following negroes to wit, Jack & Rose & Ann & my wife
 Betsey is to have her support out of them so long as she con-
 tinues a widow & conducts herself as a mother, & to my son
 Reubin I give the bequeath the following negroes to wit & Squire
 & Guder, & to my daughter Sally & to Patrick I give and
 bequeath the sum of ten dollars to be paid out of my
 estate

To my son William I give & bequeath the following negroes (to wit,
 Ward & Aggy, To my son Abram I give & bequeath the following negroes
 to wit, Janny & Jerry, & I do further give & bequeath to my sons James & Peter
 my crop of corn & hogs which is now stored & put in pens for winter use
 to be made use of for the support of my family. (To, my wife & to
 their own families & I also give & bequeath to my nephew (Sammy)
 Shaler all that part of my tract of land lying on the south side of
 Allens creek as for the rest of my lands I desire it to be divided
 between my four sons Reubin William Abram & James in
 lots of equal value as to the improvements till there is a
 decision made respecting the law suit now in court then the
 land to be sold & an equal divide to be made between
 the four above mentioned sons, & my waggon horses, cattle
 hogs, & sheep house hold & kitchen furniture, and moneys
 due to me by bond note or book account or in any other way
 whatsoever when they are sold & the money collected then to be
 made an equal divide between my four sons Reubin Abram
 William, & James & I do also constitute make & ordain my
 beloved sons Reubin, Abram, William & James my
 sole executors to this my last will & Testament & I do hereby
 utterly disallow revoke & disannul all & every other former
 Testaments Wills legacies, bequeaths & executors by me in any
 wise before now made & bequeathed ratifying & confirming
 this & no others to be my last will & Testament, in witness whereof
 I have set my hand & seal this 13th day of December in
 the year of our Lord 1810 - In presence of
 us: George Duff Jacob Pettyjohn John
