

In the name of God Amen, I Jacob Whitworth State of South Carolina Planter having acquired by purchase & otherwise divers property real & personal in this State South Carolina Georgia & elsewhere having in contemplation that men once must die & part with such their worldly acquisitions & also being as I sometimes mortally wounded likewise being desirous to designate in whom my property shall, & vest, do hereby make constitute & appoint this my last will & testament, that is to say

Whereby give Devise the aforesaid unto my beloved wife all my estate real & personal, for her own & my childrens support wherever it may be, but should she marry ~~again~~ shall be paid to her out of my said estate the sum of one hundred Dollars to be disposed of at her discretion & at her death or intermarriage the balance of my estate to be equally divided amongst my children as they come of age at the discretion of my executors, & I do hereby constitute Richard Watts & my son Samuel W. Whitworth to be whole & sole executors of this my last will & testament, In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 12th day of October in the State of Georgia in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & eleven
