Suffered the Prolonged Sycayed State of My Body & Knowing
that all men have to Die but being of sound Mind Senses
& longitude this My Last Will I Testament
Inst I make ordain & constitute my Friend & Friend Jackson
together with my two Sons Viz Alfred Smith and James
M. Smith my Executors

Item first I Leave & bequeath unto my three Sons Viz
Charles Smith Alfred Smith & James M. Smith all my
Land Wharson I now Reside to be Equally Divided between
them according to the Value of the Land Withouth the
Buildings being taken into Consideration but Leaving
Charles his Part so as to Include the Dwelling house in
which I now live together with the fire house and
all the other out buildings

Item 2^d I give & bequeath unto My Daughter Dianna the
following Negroes Viz Sylvia & her Sonman ~~son~~ Randol
ann & Rowland & two Bids & two Bids heads & furniture
one Cow & calf & one Small Cote

Item 3^d I give & bequeath to My Daughter Martha the following
Negroes Viz Jess & her Sonman Coria Mary & Jilly two bids
two Bids heads & furniture one Cow & calf & one Brown Cote

- Item 4th I give & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth the following my own bed & Chamber & her Dressing Room one bed & furniture one low & calf one Brown horse named Adam one bid bedstead & furniture one low & calf and all my stock of hogs (excepting a sow) together with the tollow fire and sheeps Markers Blacksmith and Bone Tools
- Item 5th I give and bequeath to my Son Alfred one negro fellow named Lewis one bid bedstead & furniture one low & calf & one young man named Henry Wheeler & Bayts of E. Jackson
- Item 6th I give & bequeath to my Son James M. Smith one Negro fellow named Harry one bid bedstead & furniture & one low & calf
- Item 7th I leave my old negro woman Jude to Choose at her Discretion which of my Children she will live with & the one she may Choose to live with to be bound to take care of her During her Natural Life
- Item 8th I leave & bequeath one Hundred bushels of white corn & the Present Standing Crop together with a sufficient quantity of my hogs for the support of my Family for one year
- Item 9th I leave all the Ballance of my Estate bearing & whatever it may (excepting two Lots of Land now by me in originally Early County) to be sold at publick auction at the Discretion of my Executors by their giving thirty Days notice in their newspaper place without the Delay of Making application to the Court or advertising in the publick prints
- Item 10th I leave my Land Drawn by me in Early County to be sold either at publick or Private Sale at the Discretion of a Majority of my Executors at the time of selling after said to be legally Decided among all my lawful Heirs after all my last Debts are paid

 for testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & seal this twentieth day of August 1839
