 & all the money owing to me in Kentucky, also my horse saddle
 & bridle to my daughter Mary Beavers signed sealed & delivered in the
 presence of Charles Shields, Mary Freeman, James Shields this
 19th December 1825, Subscribed before signs

Georgia In the name of God, Amen.
 I Thomas H. Wilson of the State of Georgia
 do hereby being sick but of sound mind & memory
 calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing that
 it is appointed for all persons to die do hereby declare this my
 last will & testament as follows
 First I recommend my soul to God & my body to my mother
 to be interred at the discretion of my heirs or assigns
 Second It is my will that all my just debts be paid by my
 executors & the balance of my estate whomever it hath pleased
 God to bless me it is my will that it be disposed of in the
 following manner. Item it is my will that a negro girl
 called Fena & auger more which may be of her body be
 equally divided between my daughters
