I James Lockman of the County and
State aforesaid being Minded of Death
and the frailty of life & being in Possession of a Sound
Reasoning Mind & Memory and while I also being Persuaded
before of the good things of this World that it hath pleased
God to bless me with. Do by Virtue of these presents make
this my last Will and Testament
I then & It is my Will that my body be buried in Christian
Burial Order

I think It is my Will that all my Just Debts be Paid It is
my Will that the Balance of my Estate be equally Divided
between my beloved Wife Mary Lockman & my three Daughters
to wit Judith Whinn Ann Fay & Jane Thurmond it is my
Will that Eliza Whinn Sandy Fay & Harrison Thurmond be my
Executors to carry into Effect this my last Will & Testament

In Testimony I hereunto set my hand & Seal this
Day in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred
and Twentyeight 1828

The Last Will and Testament of James
Lockman being offered to the Court of Ordinary for Probate

Peter E. McMillan Personally came into

Major James Lockman State of said County Duquand saw
him make his Signature thereto that he also saw Horatio Webb
subscribe the same as a witness which Will he read and
which I divided his Estate between his Wife Mary Lockman

other beyond it they were sworn in open Court
said that they saw the Will subscribed Eliza Whinn
Sandy Fay & Harrison Thurmond being bound in way of solemn
Testimony and among this Will was signed & attested as
above State about ten years ago as near as I can recollect
I was to in open Court Sept. 3 1838 Peter E. McMillan

Court Depose that he saw Major James Lockman
make his Signature to a paper which he said was his Will
that he was a subscribing witness with Peter E. McMillan &
that at the time said James Lockman was of sound Reasoning
Mind and Memory I was to in open Court Sept. 3 1838

Andrew McLean by testimony giving Depose that
that he subscribed as a witness a Paper that Major Lockman
said was his Will this Paper had the Major's signature thereon
I that Peter E. McMillan & Horatio Webb were subscribing
witnesses this was in the year 1828

Jacob Braughton being duly sworn in open
Court that Major James Lockman made a paper which
he acknowledged was his Will in the year 1833 that he
divided his Estate between his Wife Mary Lockman Judith
Whinn Ann Fay & Jane Thurmond & that said Will ap-
pointed Eliza Whinn Sandy Fay & Harrison Thurmond his
Executors and had his equal Signature (this James Lockman
and the said Peter E. McMillan Horatio Webb & Andrew
McLean were the subscribing witnesses and this Paper was
further said that the paper hereto attached is in substance
a Copy of the same to in open Court Sept. 3 1838
