December 1st 1814 The verbal will of Saml Elmore
 who departed this life on yesterday evening as made before
 us in the presence of Benjamin Whorton & William Whorton
 viz; first he gave to William Pison one negro but did not
 mention what kind of a one but it seemed to be understood
 by the parties what kind of a one 3rd he gave to James
 My son orphan boy up north Georgia
 My Swain a negro, I understood that he did not know
 what kind of a one it would be, but supposed it would
 be a small one 3rd he gave all the balance of his prop-
 erty to Simon White on condition that he said Elmore
 did not marry before his death & should live with said
 White the balance of his days this will was made on or a-
 bout the 28th day of October last passed

my negro man Charles together with all & singular my stock
of what ever kind household goods debts & moveables effects
excepting such part thereof as shall be ^{be} hereinafter otherwise
disposed of.

Henry Storcham Jane Storcham, John Storcham William
