 of sound and disposing mind & memory  
 do make and ordain this my last will  
 & Testament hereby revoking all others  
 first. I give & bequeath unto my son  
 James R. Glenn all that parcel a tract of  
 lands on which I now live being embracing  
 the old Boice Survey & the two other surveys  
 adjoining it and I bequeath to my self  
 all being in the County & State aforesaid  
 on Walnut Creek and its branches and  
 adjoining the lands of Mays & other  
 lands. If I should not pay it before

my death and the death of my wife Elizabeth  
 I give to my daughters Sarah Anne  
 Elizabeth and my daughter Letitia one hundred  
 dollars each.

Third - after my death and the death of  
 my beloved wife my son James R. Glen  
 shall go into possession of the above described  
 premises my daughters having received  
 the same I have several years since then  
 above - I wish my perishable property sold  
 and the proceeds thereof to go into with all  
 the property both real and personal after  
 my debts just debts are paid to be

divided by three disinterested persons  
 viz - a equal share to be drawn for my  
 minor children viz - Mary Gabe Jane Rebecca  
 John W. Glen Joshua N. Glen Edwin  
 Lowell Elizabeth Harriette Emily George  
 James R. Glen & Letitia Glen and I  
 give to each of them the share they shall  
 so draw for themselves or by their proper  
 representatives

Lastly I constitute & appoint John W. Glen  
 & Joshua N. Glen my Sons Executors of  
 this my last will and testament - In  
 witness whereof I have hereunto set my  
 hand and seal the 2nd day of December  
 1835 Signed Sealed and acknowledged in  
 presence of & attested by us in the presence of each  
 other the word "persons" intended before executed
