 all men to die & make & ordain his my last will & testament according to his
 former will by me made first & principally I give & bequeath my land to God
 who gave it & my body to the Earth to decent Christian burial nothing doubting that
 shall receive it again at the general resurrection by the mighty power of God and a
 something what worldly estate it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I do
 dispose of in the following manner

first I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Hargrave during her natural
 life the following property (viz) three Negro Men Harry, Henry & Annie &
 two women & their children Caroline & her child Amanda & Mary Ann & her two
 children Amy & William & a boy Jackson & a girl Nancy also the tract of land
 whereon I now live with all the adjoining land with all the appurtenances
 belonging to the same three Hays, Bricks her choice iron tools of iron & Hays
 three, with cows & calves & four head of other cattle ten head of sheep & twenty head
 of pigs & a sow & pigs her choice of all the stock & all the fowls & all or as many of
 the farming implements as she may wish including all sorts of tools in
 old & new & the Bibles with all the household & kitchen furniture & all
 what to help of every description & all vessels & articles that may be necessary
 for the use of the family & one year provision of all the common staples for
 the family & stock & as many books as she wants & two hundred Dollars in
 Cash & my Buggy & harness if she wants them

Secondly I give & bequeath unto Sally Buckles nine children fourteen one hundred Dollars
 each to be delivered to them as soon as it may be raised out of the estate or
 they arrive at Lawful age

Thirdly I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Cynthia for her portion one Negro Girl
 Annemore which is delivered to her

Fourthly I give & bequeath unto my Son Henry Hargrave for her one Negro Girl
 Annemore which he has in possession

Fifthly I give & bequeath unto my Son James P. Hargrave for her one Negro Girl
 Annemore which he has in possession

Sixthly I give & bequeath unto my son William P. Hargrave fourteen four hundred
 Dollars to bring him up equal with the foregoing named Legates

Seventhly I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Hyacinth Ann Buckles two children James
 & Sarah Ann Buckles for her to James one Negro boy named
 John worth fifty five Dollars & to Sarah he has received a slave & to her
 one Negro Girl Adeline & a good feather Bed & good furniture & a

Henry & who is to draw nothing more & the residue of my estate remaining at the decease of my wife Elizabeth I want that it be paid in the same manner as above & provided I survive my wife to sell my lot of my estate in order to equal my son I do hereby authorize them to sell the premises & not the above by having due publicity of such intended sale & without publishing in the public gazette having the agents who are in reach of such sale in notice and provided Henry should not die his wife I want her to take care of by one of my heirs. I want to be disposed of as the last of my estate & if he becomes the owner then they are to be compensated out of the proceeds of the estate I also authorize my executor to sell my Rail Road stock at present date if it can be done to the best advantage.

And lastly I do hereby appoint & constitute my sons Henry Hargrave and John H. Hargrave & also John H. Hargrave my executor of this my last will & testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 10th day of February 1857
