 Real or Personal Make such Distribution as shall be  
 equal between them otherwise Bequeath to my said wife  
 & make & equal Division & my beloved wife Elizabeth  
 Henderson a Child Part  
 Thirdly I will & bequeath that the peace of land & undisturbed  
 land between Andrew H Henderson and myself be divided  
 & shared by a Day since & approved accordingly  
 Fourthly I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Henderson &  
 Thomas J Henderson my beloved Son my Executors & Admin-  
 istrators of this my last will & Testament & do hereby make void all  
 other wills by me heretofore made & to declare this to be  
 my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have  
 hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal September 13<sup>th</sup> in  
 the year of our Lord 1854
