Ann Kyle & I Desire said portion to my said Son to go to and be
Waged in my said Son as Trustee for my Daughter & that said
property be controlled by my said Trustee for the benefit of my
Daughter & Francis During her life at her Death it to be Equally
Divided between her Children

Item 3^d It is my Will that neither of my Children shall be called to account
for so far as I have already given them or may advance
During my life

Item 4th Should my wife have more property that she Desires to be
Inventoried with she has Liberty to Divide Equally between my
Sons having due regard to paying Mon & wife. Mother &
Children until they have arrived at ten years of age

Item 5th After my Death I Desire that my Estate be appraised and true
of it sold

Item 6th Lastly I should recommend my wife to be buried in my son Green
L. McClellan's Burial of this my last Will & Testament
