a widow all my land negroes, horses, cattle, Sheep farming  
utensils household & furniture from time except such as  
I shall mention, Item I give thequeath to my daughter Polly  
one bed & furniture Cow & Calf four ewe, Item I give and  
bequeath to my daughter Nancy one bed & furniture cow  
& calf four ewe, Item I give thequeath to my son William  
one bed & furniture one cow & calf four ewe Item I give  
& bequeath to my daughter Anna one bed & furniture one cow  
& calf four ewe. Item I give & bequeath to my son Samuel one  
bed & furniture one cow & calf four ewe, to saye furnish after  
the death of my wife for all my property to be equally divided  
among all my children except my lands wherein I now live  
which I desire thequeath to be equally divided between my  
two sons William & Samuel, I earnestly request that my  
ne groats be directed among my children at the death of my wife  
equal & not exposed to public sale the Mare in Nickles  
Gorrell possession I give to his son James Gorrell which  
I wish to be deducted out of Mahotas gave at Beaufort  
my wifes death; in order to remove Jackson County Mills 1863-1860
