ner following viz, first of all I commend my soul into the
hands of God that gave it & my body to that it not to be buried
by my hereafter name & decent as touching my
worldly estate whereunto it hath been pleased God to
bless me I give & bequeath it as follows viz, first it is
my will & desire that all my test debts should be
paid by my executors out of my estate

Now I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary
Thurmond my negro fellow Dick & negro woman
Dick & the the plantation thought of Nicholas
Jettie also the stock house hold & kitchen furniture
& plantation tools, which at her death is to be equally
divided amongst the children

Now I give to my beloved son William Thurmond one negro
boy named Charles. Also I give to my beloved son
Phillip Thurmond one negro girl named Esther
Also I give to my beloved son John Thurmond one negro
boy named David. Also I give to my beloved son
Jefferson one negro girl named Felling. Also I give to
my beloved son Flecha one negro girl named Fanny
Also I give to my beloved son Patton one negro girl
named Lydia Lydia which negroes the afore-
said child shall have as the hereby come of age

and of either of the children, nor ever die before they
 come of age that the other children shall through in
 an equal part to make them all on a like footing
 I do hereby declare constitute & appoint my beloved wife
 Nancy Thormond my true friend Edward Adams
 my lawful & sole executor to his my last will and
 testament & all other by me made to be well & duly
 to all intents & purposes I do hereby solemnly declare
 ratify & affirm this to be my only last will & testament
 in writing signed. I have & hereunto set my hand & seal
 2nd of June 1809, Signed & sealed in presence
 of Henry Tuttle
