 Jackson County } and weak of body but of sound and disposing
 mind & memory, and willing to dispose of what worldly estate
 it has pleased God to bless me with, do make my last will
 and Testament in manner & form following, (Viz),

- 1st - It is my will and desire that all my last debts be
 punctually & honestly paid, and for that purpose do
 authorize my Executor herein after named to sell my land
 and all my stock of every description in that way he shall
 deem most advisable to enable him to pay the same, and
 should the above property be insufficient to pay my debts, it
 is my will that my Negroes be hired to trade money to pay
 the balance of my debts.
- 2nd It is my will that after my debts are all paid, my Executor
 shall hire out my Negroes until a sufficient fund be raised
 to transport them to some State in the United States where
 they will be free by the laws of the Country, and that my
 said Negroes shall after my death, have my bed and furni-
 ture divided among them, unless it should be necessary to sell
 that and my household and kitchen furniture to pay my

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debt, in which ~~my~~ Executor is authorized to dispose of them
at his discretion—

170 I hereby appoint my friend ~~Edward~~ Hinton my Executor to
this my last will and Testament, hereby giving him the right
to Conboul my said Negroes until they shall be removed
as above directed—
