- 11th The residue of my estate not herein specially willed away by the

 one hundred dollars, at the expiration of two years from the date
 I leave & bequeath to my daughter Caroline & Sarah six cows & calves each
 or cattle to that value to each of them a good riding horse or a team
 to each of them one negro child or one hundred dollars & this and no
