I John Lambert of the County & State aforesaid being indisposed in body, but of perfect sound mind & disposing memory & calling to mind the uncertainly of life do make this my last will & testament.
Item 1st I resign my body to the grave & my soul into the hands of the gracious creator in full assurance of a future resurrection & blessed immortality.
Item 2nd I give & bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Sarah Lambert four negroes namely Sally & her child Mary Ann Mary a negro man & Grigg & all the personal property that is in her hands possession at the time such as household & kitchen furniture together with the or of on the premises whereon she now resides the said personal property to belong to the said Sarah Lambert during her life time & at her death if any left to be equally divided amongst my children hereafter mentioned except the negro above mentioned which negro is to be at her own disposal.
Item 3rd I give & bequeath to my son Alexander 100 acres of land, land a negro girl Rudy, three negro boys Harrison & Bailey
Item 4th I give & bequeath to my son Washington

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a negro boy Bob, two girls, Malissa & Sarah, and
 Henry & George & he gave to my daughter Lucy Brown &
 Alice Lambert a negro girl Abby & her child & a white
 woman namely Hannah, Henry & George & he gave to my
 daughter Mary Brazel, Alice, Lambert & three white girls,
 namely Nick, Peggy & Henry, Henry & George & he gave to
 John Brazel, Alice, Lambert & three white men namely
 Charles, a boy Will, Henry & George & he gave to my son
 Edwin Lambert all the residue of my estate together with
 all the personal property that he is in possession of at this
 time & half the tract of land he ^{now} resides on at this time
 & the balance to Alexander, Percy, Washington & Mary and
 John, & the said lands to be divided according to quantity &
 quality so as to have value on each part
 Henry & George. It is my will that all my Just Debt shall be imme-
 diately paid out of my property & that of each of my children
 portions or legacies in proportion to the valuation of their
 amount, given to each child & my wife Sarah being
 Henry & George in case the said John Lambert & North draw
 in the Contemplation of said Henry having or being entitled
 to two draws if in case there should be any land or lands
 drawn in my name & it being more than it is my will
 that it be divided equally amongst my three sons
 Washington, Alexander & John
 Henry & George I do appoint & ordain Sarah Lambert my wife
 Edwin Lambert, Washington Brazel, Alice, Just Debt &
 John Mann my executors to this my last Will &
 testament making all other Wills or testaments heretofore
 by me made & declaring them by these presents to be
 null & void in witness whereof I come to it my house &
 affix my seal this 8th day of June in the year of
 our Lord eight hundred twenty six

& knowing that it is appointed to all men once to die, do make this
my last will & testament, to wit:

- 1st I give unto my wife Obedience all my estate real & personal
during her natural life with power to give away any part
thereof to such of my children or grand children as she
may find stand in need, of the same
- 2nd After the death of my wife I desire that my negroes shall
remain on my land & have the privilege of hiring their own
time & to be under the control of William Matthews & Thomas
Mitchell two of my executors herein after named the hire to be
distributed among such of my grand children as my said
by will may direct
- 3rd I desire that my wife shall give unto my two grand daughters
Susannah Pamphile & Sarah Haver fifty dollars each
if she can conveniently spare the same but if she cannot
then my surviving executor after the death of my wife to see
her part of my will is complied with
- 4th There shall be no appraisement or sale of my estate
to be managed by my wife & other executors, in such
manner as they may deem most proper
by appoint my wife Obedience my sole & only
