Georgia Jackson County I, Wm Martin, of the County & State aforesaid,
being somewhat afflicted in body but being
of sound mind & memory, and knowing that I am appointed
unto all men once to die, do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament, in manner & form following, to wit:
First, I give my soul to God who gave it, and finally
I give my body to be buried in Christian Burial Order
Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Mary Martin
one hundred acres of Land, being a part of the tract or parcel
of Land whereon I now live, taken off to ad to include the
dwelling House, and all out buildings, with all my stock
of cattle, hogs, sheep & poultry, with one Grey Mare, one Ches-
nut colored Mare, and one bright Sorrel Mare, with all
my plantation Tools, Vehicles and implements ad a home and
support for my two daughters Nancy, and Fanny, during
their Virginity, and a home for my Younger Son till they
arrive at the age of Twenty one years —

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during her natural life, and all to be disposed of at her death, have the said one hundred acres of Land, which at her death shall become the property of my two sons Levi & Maliki fourthly - I give and bequeath unto my son William Martin Twenty pounds of Horse Beathers To my Daughter Belding or one branded Cow and calf, which she now has in possession To my son Olisha Martin, one young Spanish Horse, and one Rifle Gun. To my son John Martin, one brown Mare and one Rifle Gun. To my son Olfah Martin, one brown Billy and one Musket. To my son Levi, one sorrel Colt and one Shot Gun. To my son Maliki one Spanish Horse Colt, and one Shot Gun. To my son Simon, one bay Mare Colt, and one Shot Gun.

Fiftly, I do appoint, constitute and ordain, my wife Mary Martin, Sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this day and year written. This April 16th, 1830.
