 God, to bestow on me, I do give in manner & form  
 following, I give to my son Nathan McGehee five shillings  
 & twelve pence all that he has recd. of me. to him & his  
 for ever. I give to my son Jesse McGehee one negro boy  
 named Simon & eight pounds to be paid in dollars at the  
 shillings rate to him & his heirs forever. I give to my  
 daughter Patsy McGehee a negro boy & a feather bed  
 and a black horse named Jack
