and widowhood. I leave to bequeath to my son John all the land
whereon I now live three hundred & forty four acres, with the mills
tall the appurtenances belonging thereto. I leave to bequeath to my
daughter Hannah Eastwood the first child that Phillis has or ever
hundred dollars, I receive bequeath to my son John if ever he return
one hundred dollars, at the expiration of two years from the date
I leave to bequeath to my daughter Sarah six cowhides each
or cattle to that value to each of them a good riding horse or mutton
each of them one mugs held or one hundred dollars there and no
other to follow to be my last will. The remainder I leave to those and
