her natural life. And I wish & desire for her to
continue to let the two orphan children who now
live now live with her until they shall become of
lawful age to wit John Wood & Frances Wood
I then do give & bequeath unto my nephews
James Wood & William Wood five hundred
dollars each also my nephew Henry Smith
fifty hundred dollars also to my two nieces
the Daughters of my sister Smith of Franklin
County Georgia five hundred dollars each to
John Wood & Frances Wood one thousand
dollars each to be paid out of my estate

after the decease of my beloved wife and affe-
ctionate wife Mary Robinson. And it is my will
that my beloved wife dispose of the balance of my
estate except the above specific legacies as she
may desire and determine. It is further my
wish and desire that if any of my negroes
should prove after my death to be disobedient
or troublesome to my wife she may put them
up to open sold to the highest bidder and sold
at her discretion. I further bequeath unto
Elizabeth Smith James Smith William
Smith David Smith and Israel Robinson
Wood One hundred dollars each after the
death of said wife to paid as the above specific
legacies to be paid
