

Georgia I John Winters to the County & State aforesaid Jackson County, being weak in body but of perfect mind & memory do make this my last will & testament, know I commit my soul to a merciful God who gave it - in some small hope of a resurrection hereafter.

I give to my dear wife Charity Winters all my worldly effects during her natural life or widowhood consisting of eight negroes, two white, one a woman & her daughter Martha about seven years old, Chester, a man & Charlotte a mulatto woman ^{left one by same my Pappo} woman & her son called John, until he arrives at twenty one years of age in his will which will I wish comply with four hundred thirty acres of land in DeKalb County, not yet granted No. 87, 95 & District & about two hundred fifty acres where I now live together with my stock of all kinds including the legacy coming to us by her father's estate, In the event of her not marrying she is at liberty to give her children such pieces of property as she may think proper as they advance in years, two other negroes which her daughter Charlotte now in the possession of Stephen Dale. And lastly I do constitute & appoint my said wife Charity, and her son William P. Winters or complying with the former.

Conditions of this will my executors to this my last will & testament. Given under my hand & seal this day of September 1839
