1st My last desire is that all my just debts be paid by my executors out of my estate

2nd I give & devise to my son Zachariah one certain bay horse known by the name of Betty, also one cow & calf known by the name of Jude

3rd My last desire is that my daughter Betty Morris and Hannah Morris shall have each of them a cow & calf when the same is age

4th I give & devise to my daughter Betty Duke one certain bay horse known by the name of King

5th I give & devise to my son Jesse one bay horse known by the name of Betty

6th I give & devise to my beloved wife Elizabeth Morris my land & meadow plantation tools & household furniture also one barrel mare known by the name of Jack also the whole stock of cattle & hogs all for the use of the Widow & orphans during her life or widowhood

7th I give & devise for the way gone to be sold upon a credit with as much other property as will defray all my debts that I do hereby appoint & appoint ^{compromise} Frederick Thompson Eli Mundy & the aforesaid Elizabeth Morris joint & several executors to this my last will & testament ratifying this & this only to be my last will, & nullifying all other wills & testaments by me heretofore made with my wife and I seal the date above written, signed & acknowledged in the presence of
