

In the name of God, I, Simon 3^d day of September in the year of
our Lord 1805 I John Lewis Clark of the State of Georgia twenty
of so often being sick in body but of good & sound memory thank
be to almighty God & calling to mind be once the uncertain state
of this transitory life & that all flesh must yield to death when
it shall please God, to call do make constitute ordain &
declare this my last Will & Testament in manner & form
following making & amending by these presents, all & every testament
or testamentary Will & Wills heretofore by me made & declared
either by word or writing & this is to be taken for my last Will
& Testament & no other & first being penitent & sorry from the bottom
of my heart for my sins past most humbly desire forgiveness
for the same, I give & commit my soul unto almighty God.
My savior & redeemer in whom I by the merits of Jesus Christ
trust & be lively assuredly to be saved & to have full remission
& forgiveness of all my sins & that my soul with my body at
a great day of Resurrection shall rise again with joy through
the merits of Christ's death & passion & I desire the Kingdom of
heaven prepared for his elect & chosen & my body to be buried
in such a place where it shall please my executor, hereaf-
ter named to appoint. And now for the settling my temporal
estate & such goods & chattels & debts, as it hath pleased God,
far above my deserts to bestow upon me I do order give &
dispose the same in manner & form following that is to say
first I will that all these debts, be paid as
I owe in Right or conscience to any manner of person or persons
Whatsoever shall by truly consented & paid or ordered to be
paid within convenient time after my decease by executor
hereafter named. Item first I give & bequeath unto my beloved
Wife Sarah half half the plantation on which I now live
the beds & furniture & all my household furniture & my books
with her, & my clothing & one horse & calf of her choice & twenty
five Dollars in cash & my negro man & girl while she remains
my Widow. Item 2^d I give & bequeath unto my son James Clark
the other half of my plantation on which I now live & twenty
five dollars in cash & his wagon & negro & two horses & that

marriage or decease my negro man Jim. I leave to my wife and
 bequeath to my daughter Hannah Henderson twenty five dollars in
 cash four hundred dollars. I leave to my daughter Mary two hundred dollars in cash. I leave to my daughter
 Anne ten dollars if she is not alive to be divided amongst my children Jim
 Hannah & Patsy I leave to my wife if there is any money remaining
 after paying my just debts & funeral charges I order that it is
 to be equally divided between my wife Sarah & my son James
 Clark after giving each their portion as above mentioned
 for the maintenance & schooling of my daughter Patsy
 I appoint & otherwise Thomas Fanning David M. Flourdy my
 trusty friends my executors of this my last will & testament
 not for confirmation of the above will I have hereunto
 set my hand & signed my seal the year & date first written
 in presence of
 Johnston Clark (Seal)
