Item 3^d after the Death of my wife the balance left to be Equally Divided
between my above named Children it is my Will if there shall
not be a Sufficiency of my Personal Property to Pay my Debt my
Wife is of any Portion of my Landings to be sold it should be
such a Portion as would not Interfere with my Dwelling
house & mill Larning which I wish for the Support of my Family

My will all kind of my Property as they to be sold should be
 sold by my Executors without being at the expense of advertising
 in the public Press but notice to be given by my Executors
 at as many public places as they may think proper and that
 without applying for an order of Court & the same to be sold
 on my Executors both Real & Personal property
 I do Disclaim, Revolve & Rescind all & Every other power to be
 held legally by me & my Executors by me in any way before made
 Ratifying & Confirming this & no other to be my Say & Testament
 In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 1st
 Twentyfourth Day of June 1851
