In the name of God Amen. The fifteenth day of January
 one thousand eight hundred & sixteen Joseph Culpeper of
 the State of Georgia & County of Jackson being on the bed
 of affliction but in my perfect reason & memory calling
 to mind that all men must die I do make & ordain this
 my last will Testament that is to say particularly and
 first of all, I give & recommend my soul into hands of God,
 who gave it & for my body I recommend it to the earth to be
 buried in a decent Christian like & decent manner at the
 discretion of my executors & touching such worldly estate
 where with it hath pleased God to bless me in this life
 I give devise & dispose of in the following manner
 I give & give to my son Simon Culpeper my young
 horse & to my son Henry Culpeper my Rifle Gun
 exclusive of their part with the rest balance of my
 children except my daughter Sally Culpeper which
 I give one hundred dollars exclusive of an equal part
 with the rest of my legatees, I give to my beloved wife
 Nancy Culpeper after my just debts are paid all the
 remainder of my estate together with all my lands houses and
 household furniture with stock of all kinds during her lifetime or
 widowhood at her death to be equally divided ^{between} ~~among~~ my children
 as aforesaid is hereupon delineated, But if my Nancy should think
 proper to marry again I then give her an equal part with my

Children Slickwin Countitt & Ordain with my wife Nancy Culpeper my son
 Simon Culpeper & Ambrose Youbrough my whole & sole exors of this
 my last will & Testament & I do hereby disallow revoke & disannul all former
 other former Testament wills Legacies & exors by me in any way before
 this time named Willed & bequeathed as aforesaid & conforming thereto
 to be my last ^{and sole} will & Testament in witness whereof I have unto set my
 hand and seal the day & date above written

 my body do make & ordain this to be my last will & Testament

 resurrection through the Lord Jesus Christ
 I desire all my just debts to be paid
 I give & bequeath the five children of my wife Sarah
 Love twenty five cents to each of them
 I desire the tract of land whereon I now live to be sold
 at the discretion of my exors either by public sale
 private contract or they may think most proper & after
 paying all my just debts and the legacies herein bequeathed
 all the remaining part of the price of said land together with
 all & singular my goods & chattels consisting of negroes horses
 cattle hogs household furniture & plantation tools I give
