

I George S. Joseph Davis, of the State of Georgia, being in perfect health
 and sound mind, do hereby make my last Will and Testament, in full and
 of life, knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, and desiring to settle all my
 worldly affairs, do declare this to be my last Will and Testament, in full and
 as follows:

- 1st It is my Desire that all my just Debts be lawfully paid.
 - 2nd I give to my Son Joseph H. Davis the Plantation whereon I now reside, together
 with all the land thereon, to him and his heirs forever, and I desire that he should

 - 3rd I further give to my Son Joseph H. the two horses which I now own, and
