niture together with my Negro Man Tom to have & to
Hold During her Natural Life a Widowhood in Case she
Should marry or Die the Property to be taken by her
Guardian the Walter Harris & Lawfully Sold & the money
Equally Divided amongst my Lawful ^{leg} Heirs I hereby make Constitutions
& appoint my Wife Elizabeth my sole Executrix of this
my last Will & Testament & my Son Walter Harris her
Guardian to Dispose of the Property Lawfully in Case of
her Marrying or Death I also admit my Executrix or her
Guardian to sell any Part of my Estate for her Support
at any time when she may think proper while she
remains a widow provided necessity may require it to
be Done & the Remainder Dispose of as above Mentioned
in Case of her Marrying she is to Receive her bed & bedding
with her Cloathing In Witness Whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & affixed my Seal the Day and Date
