In the name of god - I do hereby declare & Blawick say in Public hearing of sound & disposing mind and believing that I must shortly depart this life I am in Right & Just that I should make a Disposition of the property which I have a Divine providence has blessed me

here first I desire & desire that my Body be buried in a Decent & Christian like Manner & may want I Trust will Obey to God with the same It

then I give after the payment of all my ^{Just} Debts I shall & bequeath to my beloved wife Susan during her Natural life the following property (to wit) a young a Negro boy about sixteen years of age & but a Negro woman with her own also four hundred dollars to be paid in hand on her of of her death out of my present home land also the following Negro boy & children years here two three four & five years old & four more than three years old as much as she may choose out of what I have also one ^{five} hundred ^{two} hundred & two three Cents & Cents I'm read of boys on during John's life & Land on the other side of the River for the life of Susan also for the life of Susan's children with own years provision All of the above named property to go to my Children at her death

then I give to my Daughter Mary Catherine a Negro boy named Molly also to my Daughter Margaret four a Negro girl named Lela each to be divided from their respective share of my Estate at their full age when received the above named Negroes to be sent back to my other Children with their respective in the event that my said Daughters should die without issue

and the Ballance of my property I desire to be sold & the proceeds Equally divided among my legitimate Children after deducting the Ballance of the two Negro girls as above stated my God witness I give to my son Calvin of the Independent State of Maryland J. I have no more in my Brother William H Blawick together with his portion to Mary & Catherine until said Calvin shall come of age

In the first & last Place I appoint my Trusty friends Robert Meritt Williams H Blawick Executors to this my last will & I have signed sealed in the presence of
