 one feather bed & furniture all my household & kitchen furni-
 ture & all my plantation tools all to be at her disposal
 except one cupboard which at my said wifes desire
 I give my son Joseph

2nd I give to my daughter baby Shields during her natural
 life one negro man named Sam & one girl named Esther
 & at her my said daughters death the said negroes with
 future increase to be equally divided among her
 children

3rd I give to my daughter Esther Early during her natural life
 one negro man named Guy, one girl named Rina & one
 named Leah, with their future increase & at her death
 the said negroes with their increase to be equally divided
 among her children

4th I give to my grand children the children of my daughter
 Morgan, Brown one negro man named Ben & one girl
 named Hannah with her future increase

to be equally divided among her children then at the death of my
of my said daughter but during her natural life it my will that the said
income shall be for the support of my said daughter under the management
that the discretion of my executor

3rd I give to my son in law Isaac Cowen four hundred fifty dollars
which is to be paid to him by my son Joseph I. Scott & made out of the
the property which I shall bequeath to him in lieu of a negro man
I also give to the said Isaac Cowen one negro boy named Willis to him
this heirs forever

4th I give to my son Abraham Scott one negro woman named Siller
ther six children with their future increase all of which he has
now in his possession to him this heirs forever

5th I give to my son Joseph I. Scott one old negro woman named
Silva, one negro woman named Dier ther two children named
Hart & Nelson, one negro fellow named Clatton & one boy
named Lewis with their future increase to him this heirs
forever

6th I give to my grandson Joseph I. Scott & son of Abra-
ham Scott one negro girl named Violet ther future increase
to him this heirs forever

7th The balance of my estate not herein before disposed of
I give to my son Joseph I. Scott to be by him disposed of
as he may think best for himself & mother

10th I hereby appoint my son Joseph I. Scott & William Potts
my executors to this my last will Testament hereby
revoking any former will or wills by me made hereof
made &c. I the witness whereof I the said Joseph Scott min-
hath hereunto set my hand & seal this 20th day of November

Item 2nd I give the tract of land to my son Charles where he now lives
as long as he lives on it & when he removes off that tract to be
divided in the same way that the land will where I now live

Item 3rd All the land & negroes with the remaining stock to be
disposed or divided equally among my four children to wit
Daniel Heard, Elizabeth Norman, Charles Heard, and
Mary Heard after the death of my wife

Item 4th One negro woman in Wilkes County by the name of Agg
to be sold to pay my just debts

Item 5th I give to my grand daughter A. Caroline Norman
one bay filly & one hifer that Charles Heard let her
