Calling to mind the mortality of Man, and the Changeable state of all sublunary things, feeling a desire to make some order of arrangements and point out such mode of distribution of the property it has pleased God, to possess me of whilst I am living, as I wish to be made by my hereinafter named Executors, after my decease in form & order following. That is after my body is returned to its Mother Earth, & my soul to God, who gave it. It is my will and dying request, that after adjusting all my temporal Concerns, and paying off my just debts that my remaining, both real & personal estate be divided as follows
 To wife, I give and bequeath two Negroes a Man by the name of Anderson, and Susan with the increase of said Susan during the natural life of my said wife Martha, at her death, said Negroes, with the increase of said woman Susan to be returned to my estate, and to be equally divided between my hereinafter named Children, and the one my wife is supposed to be pregnant with. N. B. I gave to my Daughter-in-law Levi Lowry a Bill of Sale for the above named Girl Susan, on verbal consideration before Matthew McCullers & Alfred Dow. that he, said Lowry was not to take her from me. I give and bequeath to my son Camiller, two Negro boys, Viz Mack a boy about twenty years old & Williard a boy nine years old. also two good work Horses with plough, and Gear to work said Horses. also one Sow & pigs, one Cow & calf, one feather Bed & furniture for it. I give and bequeath to my

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son La Fayette two Negro boys, Viz Willidge about nineteen years old
& Anderson a boy four years old. also two good plough horses, and
ploughs and team to work the same. also one cow & calf one sow
& pigs, one feather Bed & furniture for the same.

I give to my son Ignatius two Negro boys Viz John a boy nineteen
years old, and Newton a boy about six years old. also two horses
with ploughs & team to work the same. one cow & calf. one sow & pig
one bed and furniture.

I give and bequeath to my son William & Simon two Negro
boys Viz Justin a boy fourteen years old & Byron a boy five years
old. also two horses with ploughs & team to work the same. also
one cow & calf one sow & pigs, one feather Bed & furniture.

I give and bequeath to my son Leonida Allen two Negro boys
Viz Sima a boy ten years old, Cyrus a boy child one year old. also
two horses & ploughs & team to work the same. also one cow & calf
one sow & pigs, one feather Bed & furniture for the same.

As my wife is now pregnant with a child. I give & bequeath
the said Child the same amount of property and to enjoy the
same advantages, schooling and maintenance, and other advan-
tages of any kind that the others may have from my estate, ~~and~~
Specially two Negro boys, a cow & calf, sow & pigs, Bed & fur-
= niture horses & team. It is my will that when my son Camillus
arrives at the age of maturity there shall be a division of all
my estate remaining undivided, among my before Children
in such a manner as to make the legacy of each child equal.

It is my will that ~~the~~ property be all kept together until
a division, on my plantation where I now live. My wife
whom I hereby appoint Executrix may put her property
on the plantation with my estate during her widowhood and
the whole be managed by her, & she shall draw a support
out of the proceeds annually, unless she should choose to draw
her legacy from the estate, and keep her property to itself
at which time her Executorship, or management of my estate
shall cease and be at an end. I also hereby nominate and
appoint my son Camillus Executor to my estate which
executorship to commence at the earliest date that the
law will admit of. It is my will that each of my boys

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Children be given at least a finished English Education, say
 Mathematics in all its highest branches, with Surveying, English
 grammar &c. My undivided, in part - is as follows, Betty,
 Judae, Will, Eleanor, Rachel, Mary, Cornelia, Caroline,
 Betty, Laura - 1760. acres land Franklin. the home place.
 1000 acres on Currier Creek Jackson County, my
 present residence - If either of my children shall loose the
 specific Legacy or any part it is to be made up out of my
 undivided, this 10th day of May 1833. Leonidas Jew
