 I commend my soul to God who gave it, my body to the
 earth. — I Lewis Minor being in sound mind & memory, I make this
 my dying testimony, I desire that the following directions
 be attended to, Margaret Miliak to have a negro woman Caroline at
 the death of my wife, this negro woman have when children before the
 death of my wife they are my wife's, John Minor to have a negro boy
 named Henry, Isaac Minor to have a tract of land, Mary
 Miliak to have a negro girl named Larky Sue, my Abraham
 Minor to have a horse worth eighty dollars & three hundred dollars in
 money when he arrives to the age of twenty one years,
 Edwina Minor to have three hundred dollars ^{in money} when he arrives to the age
 of twenty one years, Nancy Minor to have three hundred dollars in
 money when she arrives to the age of twenty one years, My wife Nancy
 Minor to have a negro man named James, & a negro girl named
 Malissa & a negro girl named Jane & a negro boy named James.
 The land that we now live on, two horses & the cattle & the household articles
 & the furniture & plantation tools, one lot of land in Milledgeville county
 formerly when granted by John Minor, one half of that land to be
 given to my wife Nancy Minor, All the above properties given to
 my wife during her natural life & at her death to be equally divided
 amongst all the legatees, A tract of land that in Clark County that
 John Miliak now lives on to be given to his son John Miliak,
 Henry Adams a coloured free man that is in my possession I leave
 in the hands of my wife to be at her disposal

Georgia Jackson County I William Reynolds of the County & State aforesaid being
weak in body but of sound mind & disposing memory do
make my last will & testament in the following words to wit:
1st That all my real estate together with my personal property shall
be sold & equally divided between John Reynolds my son & Elizabeth King
Parker Puckter grals, Sarah West, Rhoda Patterson, & Francis Gilman
with the exception of two hundred fifty acres of land whereon
I now live which is to remain in the possession of John Reynolds
my wife for her support during her life & after her death to be
equally divided between the above mentioned heirs
2nd That sixty dollars shall be taken out of the sale of the first
property & put on interest & when Amanda Caroline Reynolds
daughter of Francis Reynolds becomes of age shall receive the
said amount with all the profits arising from said amount
and in case the said child should die before it be come of age
the amount shall be equally divided between the above mentioned
heirs 3rd I hereby constitute & appoint John Reynolds William
Patterson executors to this my last will & testament
