land in Early County known & distinguished by lot No 1st

in the sight of the district this last my said wife is to have the disposal of
at any time. But as before at her marriage or death, to be equally
divided amongst my three children above named freely by them to
be possessed. Ratifying & confirming in this to be my last will & Testament
Item I do give to my daughter Elizabeth the sum of five dollars
Item I do give to my son William Wallis children the sum of five dollars
Item I do give to my son Thompson the sum of five dollars

Item I do give to my son Daniel the sum of five dollars in signi-
fied & delivered his presence of us — 17th day of December 1824
